- This pig farm contains cruelties that are beyond comprehension - cruelties that are protected and funded by the Canadian Government.



We found this tiny piglet hanging by his chin to a hole in the plastic grating of a farrowing crate. Up until that point, the Justice for the Silenced investigators didn't understand why "drowning" was written down on the piglet mortality sheets as one of the reasons for death.

He was likely hanging there for hours while his mom lay feet away imprisoned inside of a small crate unable to help him.

Our investigators managed to remove him, returning him to the warmth and safety of his mother. Although he was saved from drawing that night, he will continue to experience systematic exploitation and abuse until he is separated from his mother and sent to a slaughterhouse, that is, if he makes it that long. His story represents one out of the millions of piglets across the nation who are forced into horrific and unimaginable situations.
